RE: 2018 Year in Review

The Lord continues to bless our ministry and the good works of Pastor William and Martha Makali in the Yulansoni Valley of Tanzania. Through generous financial donations from churches and individuals we now complete our 23rd year of life-saving support.

We invested \$36,142 for medical services, preschool education (including a hot meal each day), rabies clinic, our fresh-water well and special hunger relief. We are especially grateful to the overwhelming support we received after learning of the drought and corn worm infestation that devastated crops resulting in famine. Over \$9,000 came to us through a variety of creative ways and as you'll read in our report, thousands were fed.

Here's more about services in 2018:

#### Medical Services and Support:

874 individuals were treated as patients within our medical clinic - 36% of those were under 5 years of age. The most prevalent cases were Urinary Tract Infections, Malaria and Pneumonia. Overall, there were 1691 diagnosis within the clinic. 218 individuals also made use of our overnight stay facility.

We are also very involved in preventive services. 807 mothers took advantage of our Postnatal and Prenatal counseling and care efforts. We were also able to distribute more than 200 pairs of donated eye glasses.

These numbers have increased from years past. Pastor William notes that our contributions have allowed the clinic to remain fully stocked with medicine and keep staff in place to service the community 24/7. The same cannot be said for many of the government clinics in the area.

#### Preschool Education:

97 children, ages 4-6 attend the preschool. Given this large number, we now offer classes in morning and afternoon sessions. We've also been able to continue to offer a hot lunch each day. All 70 eligible children will move on to Primary School.

### Rabies Clinic:

We continue to support life-saving rabies clinics throughout the valley. Through the leadership of Dr. Dan Randall, FDM Vice Chairman and local Greenville Veterinarian, 1630 dogs in over 23 separate locations were treated. Since our first effort in 2013, more than 5600 dogs have been treated.

According to the District Medical Officer, the number of dog bite victims by unvaccinated dogs has sharply declined! This life-saving service also allows FDM to step into the villages and interact with the people directly.

### Famine Relief:

A drought and corn worm infestation resulted in a crisis situation for valley residents in 2018. The corn crop that serves as a food supply and bartering tender was destroyed. Pastor William alerted us and donors responded! Through a musical event and an on-line funding site, more than \$9000 dollars were donated for food and seed purchase. Over 13 tons of food - purchased in "food sacks" that can feed a household of 7 for two days - was purchased and delivered throughout the valley. We continue to track the process of this situation and pray for a healthy harvest to come!

We marvel at the continued energy and passion displayed by Pastor William and Martha Makali. Together they have done an outstanding job to ensure that our financial support is extended as far as possible.

We know that a time will come when Pastor William and Martha will require rest from this mission field. We pray that conversations initiated this year with the United Methodist Church in Tanzania result in a long-term relationship so Full Dimension Ministry can continue to share the word and deeds of Jesus Christ with our brothers and sisters in Tanzania for decades to come.
